Presentation



From April 30th to May 3rd 2013, the second edition of the International Renal Meeting and Mayo Clinic Day in Sardinia will be held in Cagliari.

Thanks to the experience we acquired and the appreciation expressed by the participants in the past edition, we feel encouraged to maintain the same structural organization, as well as to carry out a thorough analysis of the topics that have recently been debated at major international conferences and to devote ample time to discussing them.

As regards kidney transplant, we will focus our attention on the main causes of late graft loss and on how to minimize or even discontinue CNI treatment, in view of the potential contribution of new biological drugs and laparascopic living donor nephrectomy.

As far as clinical nephrology is concerned, we will focus our attention on the molecular basis and treatment of FSGS with biological drugs. One of the lectures will deal with the morphogenesis and the molecular basis of the development of the human kidney. Other lectures will analyze the changes that have taken place during the past 15 years regarding HUS/TTP, the treatment of glomerulonephritis, the results of the VALIGA Study and the pathogenesis of IMN. Moreover, this year we will include a session on the epidemiology of CKD and on the most recent aspects concerning the possibilities of slowing down the progression of renal damage. There will also be a session on Hyponatremia and Aquaretic therapy.

Concerning dialysis, a whole session will be devoted to the *Critical Care* of dialyzed patients, and a Satellite Mini Course for Nephrology Fellows on Peritoneal Dialysis will be held.

Again this year, we will be honored by the presence of our Colleagues from the Mayo Clinic of Rochester, coordinated by Prof. Fernando Fervenza. For the Second Mayo Clinic Day in Sardinia, they will present a number of lectures, with a view to comparing their findings with an Italian discussant. In this edition of the Meeting, we will discuss a number of topics, such as Persistent post-infectious GN, ADPKD, Renovascular Hypertension, Hyperoxaluria, monoclonal gammopathies, glomerular disease and pregnancy in ESRD. There will also be a Lunch Meeting devoted to Anemia- Cardio-Renal (ACR) Syndrome.

The Meeting will be enriched by a clinical, hands-on update on Cryoglobulinemia.

We have chosen the same period of the year as the first edition to allow you to enjoy the special atmosphere offered by the city during the day of the traditional St. Efisio festival.

The tradition of the Sant'Efisio festival originated in the mid seventeenth century when a terrible plague swept across Sardinia decimating the population in four years. Ten thousand people died in Cagliari alone and the town councilors prayed to Sant'Efisio to save the city. When the epidemic finally passed in May 1657, the people of Cagliari kept the promise they had made to the saint and carried his sacred image in procession from Cagliari to Nora every year on May 1st and it is a magical celebration of faith and folklore, the sacred and the profane. The event attracts thousands of tourists from every part of the world.

At night, after the working sessions, we will take a guided tour of some of the historical monuments and scenic sites of the city and we will have the opportunity to visit the Molentargius Park, one of the most beautiful naturalistic places, where thousands of pink flamingos can be seen.

The Meeting will be opened by a lecture on the history of the city, in the extraordinary frame of the ancient heart of the old city.

Therefore, on behalf of myself, of Dario Roccatello, Co-President of the Congress and of Fernando Fervenza, who is responsible for the organization of the day devoted to the Mayo Clinic, I am pleased to invite all of you to participate, since only thanks to the early registration of numerous participants will we be able to organize this Congress in this difficult financial context. During coffee breaks and lunches we will offer you the typical, locally produced goods.

We will also try to keep the registration fee as low as possible.

We look forward to seeing you in Cagliari and trust that the quality of the scientific program, together with Sardinian hospitality and this peaceful environment will guarantee a successful outcome.
