Although the annual meeting is officially in English, RSNA offers translation services in Chinese, Dutch, French, German, Italian, Japanese and Spanish at the Help Centers.

International Invitation Letter

RSNA offers an official letter of invitation for RSNA 2015 attendees. The letter of invitation, though not required for the visa application, can assist as a supporting document. Present this letter of invitation from RSNA to the Consular Officer during the visa interview.

All visa applicants are advised to apply for their visas as soon as travel to the United States is contemplated, and not later than 3-4 months in advance. Apply early!

Visa Waiver Program
